Forestry Tour to Sweden & Norway

May 27 – June 14, 2016

The Oregon Woodland Cooperative (OWC) and the Washington Co. Small Woodlands Association (WCSWA) have organized a special tour to Scandinavia for their members and other small woodland owners in the US. The tour will focus on the role of cooperatives in private forestry in Sweden and Norway. We will meet private woodland owners and tour their tree farms, see harvesting equipment in action, and visit forestry companies, sawmills, equipment manufacturers, and forestry museums. In addition, tour participants will see and experience outstanding natural beauty in the farms, forests, mountains and fjords of Sweden and Norway, and enjoy the cultural highlights of the towns and cities along the way. Includes special group-rate international airfare. Travel will be by private motor coach and accomodation in first-class hotels.

1. PRELIMINARY ITINERARY (subject to change)

Day 0 Friday 27 May: Depart Portland

International flights on Icelandair depart from Portland to Stockholm, via Reykjavik, Iceland.

Day 1 Saturday 28 May: Arrive Stockholm

Meet Jan Hedberg at Arlanda Stockholm airport. Welcome lunch and Drottningholm castle. Hotel in Stockholm. **(Dinner not included).**

Day 2 Sunday 29 May: Stockholm

Guided tour of Stockholm, including the old town, the royal palace, Vasa Museum, and Skansen (www.skansen.se), an open-air museum featuring typical buildings from all over Sweden and our common animals. **31 miles. Breakfast, lunch and dinner included.**

Day 3 Monday, 30 May: Stockholm

LRF, Nat board for forest owner associations, after lunch some more program and free time.

Day 4 Tuesday 31 May: Stockholm-Uppsala-Falun

Bus to Uppsala to meet at the head office of Mellanskog (www.mellanskog.se) forest owner associations. See the famous church in town. Continue by bus up to Dalarna and Falun for two nights. Stop along the way to see a couple of timber buildings, met two different forest owners and maybe a logging operation along the road. See the biggest Dalecarlian horse (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Dalecarlian_horse) in the world. Bus guided tour in Falun and ski area. Hotel in Falun. **156 miles. Breakfast, lunch and dinner included.**

Day 5 Wednesday 1 June: Falun-Grangärde-Kopparberg-Falun

Visit at Falu copper mine www.falugruva.se, one of Swedens 15 World Heritage Sites and home of StoraEnso Forest company, the world's oldest stock company. Bus tour to LogMax Company www.logmax.com to see production of forest harvester heads in Grangärde. Possible stop for forest harvest operations along the road. Visit a "hytta/masugn" to understand the forest history, mining/forestry development in Sweden. In the evening, enjoy outdoor dinner at Jan's cabin at a lake in the forest outside Kopparberg. Hotel in Falun. **188 miles. Breakfast, lunch and dinner included.**

Day 6 Thursday 2 June: Falun-Sundborn-Nysjön-Alfta-Mora

Guided tour of famous Carl Larsson home in Sundborn www.clg.se. Visit a small woodland owner to discuss the forest owner's daily situation. Visit Nysjöns Fäbod close to the border of Hälsingland county, featuring old summer houses made of timber and traditional living in the forests of Scandinavia. Additional forestry visit along the way to Mora. Hotel in Mora. **157 miles. Breakfast, lunch included; Dinner not included**

Day 7 Friday 3 June: Mora

Torbjörn Wiklund will be our extra guide for this day. We will take a day trip around the Lake Siljan. Visit forest research station, Pinus contorta, logging operation. Lunch at the internationally-popular Tällberg (<http://www.tallbergsby.com>), one of the most beautiful spots in Sweden. See Dalecarlian horse production in Nusnäs and the Siljansnäs nature museum. Dinner at Fryksås fäbod with wonderful overview of Siljan. Hotel in Mora. **125 miles. Breakfast, lunch and dinner included.**

Day 8 Saturday 4 June: Mora-Sälen-Elverum

Travel on the bus along the road where the longest ski race in the world is held, the Vasaloppet www.vasaloppet.se to Sälen at the border of Norway. Historical point with log push over the water edge, Flisa Bridge, visit to Odd Heruds forest farm. Hotel in Elverum.

Day 9 Sunday 5 June: Elverum – Lillehammer.

Proceed to the Elverum forest museum, where we meet our Norwegian guide, Øystein Ramberg. Possible lecture about Norwegian forestry etc. We go via HONNE/BIRI after the visit at the museum, we continue to LILLEHAMMER where the winter Olympics were held in 1994. We pay a visit to the OLYMPIC PARK so we can see the ski jump area and get a feeling for the winter games back in 1994. Stay the night at the RADISSON Blu Lillehammer Hotel. www.lillehammerhotel.no. **133 miles. Breakfast and dinner included; lunch not included.**

Day 10 Monday 6 June: Lillehammer – Dombas - Andalsnes.

Continue north through GUDBRANSDALEN to DOMBAS. Here we stop for lunch (not included). Then we continue west in GUDBRANSDALEN through LESJA and BJORLI. Stop at the SAGELVA to watch the old sawmill and power station (www.sagelva.net). Continue down the ROMSDALEN (Valley), passing by the waterfalls, the famous TROLLVEGGEN and the famous mountain ROMSDALSHORN.

Some forest visit organized by MJOSEN Forest Assoc. Visit the STAVE CHURCH in RINGEBU. On to SAGELVA and down to Aandalsnes for overnight. Overnight at GRAND HOTEL BELLEVUE www.grandhotel.no. **164 miles. Breakfast and dinner; lunch not included.**

Day 11 Tuesday 7 June: Andalsnes Area, Innfjorden.

Today we will visit the HAGE family in INNFIJORDEN, www.lensmansgarden.no. We will visit their farm and their summer mountain pasture to see how the Norwegian farmers worked at their summer farms from the late 19th to mid-20th centuries. We will also visit a modern milking farm. We can also arrange an optional fishing trip in the fjord for a little extra cost for those who are interested. **15 miles. Breakfast and dinner; lunch not included.**

Day 12, Wednesday, 8 June: Andalsnes – Loen.

Today we are going to drive one of the most beautiful roads in the world. First we are climbing up the TROLLSTIGEN road and passing by the majestic mountains “The King, the Queen and the Bishop.” Drive over the mountains and down to NORDALFIJORD. Cross over by ferry to EIDSDAL. Continue over to the GEIRANGERFIJORD (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Geiranger_Fjord) – the most famous fjord in the world. <http://www.visitalesund-geiranger.com/en/>. See the beauty of nature and continue down to the little town of GEIRANGER where we can buy our lunch. Drive up the majestic road to the mountain of DALSNIBBA close to 5000 feet above the ocean. Then the coach takes us westwards and down to NORDFIJORD and to the hotel ALEXANDRIA, www.alexandra.no, in

the little town of LOEN for dinner and overnight. **102 miles. Breakfast and dinner included; lunch not included.**

Day 13 Thursday 9 June: Loen - Eidsfjord.

We begin today with a visit to the BRIKSDALE GLACIER (www.briksdalsbre.no). The trip through the valley is very beautiful. In the end of the valley, we climb over in small cars which take us almost all the way to the glacier.

We drive through the JOSTEDALEN, the biggest valley in northern Europe. Drive down to LERDAL and through the longest car tunnel in the world (15 miles). We will pass through AURLAND and FLOM which borders the longest fjord in the world, SOGNEFJORDEN (<http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Sognefjorden>). We continue through the mountains to GUDVANGEN and stop at the famous hotel STALHEIM.

In the afternoon, visit the KJEASEN MOUNTAIN FARM (<http://www.visitnorway.com/us/Product/?pid=104716>). Continue to the EIDSFJORD and hotel QUALITY INN, www.frihetsopplevelse.no, for dinner and overnight. **158 miles. Breakfast and dinner included; lunch not included.**

Day 14 Friday 10 June: Eidsfjord - Dalen.

On to TELEMARK and forest program in the afternoon. Overnight DALEN hotel.

Day 15 Saturday 11 June: Dalen - Oslo.

On to Oslo. Maybe we can put in some forestry program here.

Thon Hotel Opera for dinner and overnight, www.thonhotel.no. **207 miles. Breakfast and dinner included; lunch not included.**

Day 16 Sunday 12 June, Oslo:

A day of sightseeing in Oslo. Visit the HOLMENKOLLEN SKI AREA, KONTIKI (Thor Heyerdal) Museum. VIKING SHIP Museum and the FRAM museum. Visit the ROYAL PALACE (outside) and the AKERSHUS CASTLE (outside). Drive through the city center and back to the hotel. Rest of the day at leisure. **20 miles. Breakfast and dinner included; lunch not included.**

Day 17, Monday, 13 June, Oslo:

We will visit the Forestry University in As, south of Oslo. If we are not able to get any lecture about Norwegian forestry Sunday the 5th, we can have it this day. I do have some forestry farmers who can take us this day.

Day 18, Tuesday, 14 June: Oslo - Portland

After breakfast (included) there will be some hours at leisure in OSLO . Approximate * depart from the hotel to OSLO Airport at GARDERMOEN. **25 miles.** International flights on Icelandair depart from Oslo to Portland via Reykjavik, Iceland.

The participants must pay for 2 dinners and 8 lunches.

3. RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENTS

Advance reservations are required. The tour is limited to a maximum of 42 participants. Reservations are accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Reservation Form: To make a reservation, each person should complete and return the reservation form. Download and print the PDF form from the OWC member website or contact Richard Hanschu if you need a form mailed or e-mailed to you.

Deposit: To hold a tour reservation, each participant must pay a deposit of \$600 before or after submitting their reservation form. **Please pay your deposit no later than Tuesday, October 1, 2015.** Reservations will be confirmed until or after that date only with payment in full of the required deposit and only if space is still available.

Final Payment: Participants with confirmed reservations will be notified in advance of the final tour price (see above). **The final balance is due 75 days prior to departure: Friday, March 13, 2015.** Failure to pay on time will result in cancellation of your reservation. See tour company cancellation fees below.

4. ESCAPE TRAVEL GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

Travel Documents

It is the responsibility of each participant to obtain proper travel documents, such as passport and visa. Each participant must be in possession of a passport with a validity of at least six (6) months beyond the conclusion of their trip. A visa is not required for Scandinavia or Western Europe for stays of less than 3 months. A visa is required for participants travelling to Russia.

It is imperative that the airline ticket matches your name as it reads in your passport. Any changes to your air booking, which include spelling, are subject to a minimum change fee of USD250. With full payment, tour documents are normally sent 14 – 21 days prior to departure and should arrive within 6 business days. If you request documents earlier, and if it is possible to accommodate you, there is a USD 25 per reservation handling/express fee.

Cancellations

The following per person cancellation fees apply:

- 74-45 days prior to departure: USD 1500,-
- 44-7 days prior to departure: USD 2000,-
- Less than 7 days prior to departure: nonrefundable.

Cancellation fees may also apply to any additional services, including accommodations, independently supplied services, cruises, and optional excursions reserved prior to, during and after the tour. Cancellations must be in writing. A change of itinerary or traveler name (substitution) after receipt of deposit will be treated as a cancellation and new reservation; standard cancellation fees apply. Trip cancellation insurance is recommended.

Insurance

The client is urged to protect his/her investment with their own travel insurance. Escape Travel does not provide travel insurance. Generally pre-existing conditions can be covered if premium payment is made within 15 days of your initial trip deposit. Escape Travel is not responsible for loss, damage or theft of luggage or personal belongings, or for personal injury, accident or illness.

Changes

Once deposit has been received, each subsequent change will be subject to a change fee minimum USD 50 per person, only if we can accept the change and travel documents have not been issued. If documents are issued and we can accept the change and travel documents have not been issued. If documents are issued and we can accept the change there will be an additional reissue fee minimum of USD350 per person plus any fees assessed by air/land supplier/s.

Air Transportation

Price is based on scheduled transportation in economy class and nonrefundable airfare on one of our preferred airlines partners (if requesting a specific carrier, an additional charge may apply) from the city specified in the itinerary. The tour package price reflects airfare

currently in effect and is subject to change until ticketed. Inquire about airfare options from your home city. Passengers coming from different cities, booked or deposited at different times, may be booked on alternate routings/different flights. Passengers are responsible for charges due to delays on domestic flights (purchased as separate tickets). In connection with an international flight. If using frequent flyer miles, participants must be booked directly with the carrier.

Purchase of domestic ticket to connect with International Flight:

It is recommended that you do not purchase airlines tickets until the land portion of your tour is guaranteed to operate. If booking a domestic flight to connect with the trans-Atlantic flight, an overnight (at least for eastbound travel) or an early flight (with at least one backup flight available) is recommended.

Also note: carriers will not necessarily allow passengers to check bags through to the final destination with multiple tickets. Thus passengers will only be able to check the bag to the destination on the first ticket(s). The passenger must collect the baggage at baggage claim for their first ticketed destination, and re-check their baggage with the down-line carrier for the next flight. Various baggage restrictions may also apply subject to carrier guidelines.

Escape Travel is not responsible for:

Any costs/fees relating to airlines delays, rescheduling or cancellation. If you miss your departure flights it is your responsibility to work with the airline on which you are ticketed to reach your destination. Any additional expenses incurred prior to joining the tour package and will not provide any refund for services or portions of trips missed due to cancelled, rescheduled or delayed flights.

Fuel Surcharges and taxes

Your initial billing will include the current estimated charge based on your flight itinerary. Final charges for fuel and taxes will be assessed in your statement prior to final payment.

Land cost

The tour price is based on a minimum of 30 persons. The trip will be feasible with fewer than 30, but if the minimum number of passengers is not reached, the price may increase or services may be modified to accommodate a smaller group. All rates are based on tariffs in effect at the time the tour was planned and are subject to increase in the event of currency fluctuation.

Land Transportation

First-class private motor coach. Other transportation and/or accommodations as indicated. For this tour, we will use a Swedish coach company which serves both countries. Therefore the group does not have to change bus when crossing the border into Norway.

Luggage

Size and weight limitations for carry-on and checked baggage on international, inter-European flights and domestic flights vary from airlines to airline and are subject to change, so please check with the applicable carrier prior to departure. On the land portion,

due to limited motor coach capacity, we allow only 1 suitcase and 1 carry-on per person. Luggage handling at hotels for 1 suitcase is provided. Airport portorage is not included as security regulations require that travellers handle and be responsible for their own luggage. No responsibility is accepted for loss of or damage to baggage or any of the travellers' belongings. Baggage insurance is recommended.

Special requests

Special hotel and flight requests, such as "double bed", "room near elevator", "room on lower floor", "meals", "seating on aircraft", etc., should be submitted in writing with final payment. Such requests, however, are outside of our control and therefore cannot be guaranteed. Please note: A quote does not constitute a reservation. All reservation requests outside of the group arrangements outlined in the itinerary, such as additional hotel nights, add-on airfares, date deviations must be explicitly requested by the tour participants and confirmed in writing by Escape Travel.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted on airplanes, motor coaches or several public indoor areas.

Hotels

Accommodations in rooms with private facilities at hotels specified or similar, Escape Travel reserves the right to substitute hotels. Rooms in Scandinavia hotels may have twin, double or day beds. As Scandinavian hotels generally have small rooms, we advise against requesting triple rooms. Triple rooms are available on request only and no discount applies. A limited number of single rooms are available at the supplementary cost shown. Single rooms are generally inferior to double rooms in size and location. All rooms are assigned by the hotel management upon arrival. Please note that throughout Europe it is standard policy that hotel rooms are not available for check-in before 2:00pm. Requests for special room assignment should be submitted in writing with final payment. Special room requests cannot be guaranteed. Please be advised that not all hotels in Scandinavia are air-conditioned.

Service Charges, Tips & Taxes

Gratuities to tour director/guide and driver are customarily left to the discretion of the tour member and are therefore not included in the tour cost. All service charges and taxes at hotels are included, so extra tipping will not be necessary.

Meals

Breakfast, lunch and dinner as specified in the itinerary. Special requests for meals should be submitted in writing with final payment. Special meal requests cannot be guaranteed.

Unused Services

A credit of \$50 per night per person, pending confirmation, will be granted for unused hotel services only upon advance notification to Escape Travel prior to final payment. No refunds will be given after this time period. If after returning, you wish to inquire about any travel arrangements provided, please ensure that all correspondence relating to those services is received by Escape Travel within 14 days of the travel completion date.

Itinerary Variations

Escape Travel constantly strives to improve each itinerary to your benefit. If improvements can be made or unforeseen conditions make changes necessary, we reserve the right to vary itineraries or substitute hotels for operational reasons.

Not Included

Airport/hotel transfers if your flight does not coincide with the reserved group air space. Persons on other transatlantic flights should plan to transfer to/from hotel at their own expense;

- Airport fees and taxes;
- Passport fees;
- Visa fees, where required;
- Personal expenses such as laundry, liquors, wines, mineral waters, phone, valet, etc.;
- Meals not specifically listed as included;
- Expenses due to flight delays, strikes, bad weather or other irregularities;
- Travel insurance;
- Excess baggage charges;
- Individual services apart from the group;
- Refunds for tour services not utilized;
- Any expenses for à la carte meal items not included in preplanned menus;
- Gratuities for tour director, city guides and driver.

Participation

Escape Travel reserves the right to accept or reject any vacation participant and to remove any participant whose conduct is deemed incompatible with the interest of the other Participants. Children, traveling with an adult, may be accepted, for participation from the age of 8 years. Travelers must report any disability requiring special attention at the time of registration. A qualified and physically able companion must accompany travelers who need assistance (such as walking, getting on and off motor coach, etc.) and must assume full responsibility for their well being. Motorized scooters are unsuitable for tours outlined in this brochure.

Responsibility

Escape Travel, its agents, employees, representatives, associated companies and travel agencies through which the tour was booked, are not responsible for any damages, accidents, losses, detention, annoyance, consequential damages of any kind; delays, and expenses due to same; quarantine, strikes, force majeure, failure of any means of conveyance to arrive or depart as scheduled; disturbances, government actions, restrictions or regulations, discontinuance or change in transit or hotel services or schedules; and any other causes over which we have no control and which are not caused by any negligence, wrongful action or omission on the part of Escape Travel, its agents, employees, representatives, associated companies and travel agencies. Without limiting the above, you are hereby given notice, and you hereby understand and agree that all tickets and coupons issued, and all arrangements for transport or conveyance, or for hotel accommodations, and any other arrangements provided herein, are made only on the
